About Rachel Shapes

Rachel Nwokoro is a published author, director, actor, spoken word artist and activist based in North London. Author of 'Little You' (Burning eye, 2019). In the past she has worked with the National Theatre, NSPCC, Nationwide, Stonewall UK, Sofar Sounds, Roundhouse, Nickelodeon and festivals in the UK and abroad.

Rachel is also queer, black and disabled. She is dedicated to using her voice and art to work with under-represented people and stories. She believes fiercely in her heart that positive change and revolution can be created through the arts, and as such, her work includes community inreach, participation work and arts- based social activism.

Rachel is currently working towards her most ambitious project to date: a

multidsicplinary national arts project to confront and illuminate the mental health crisis for black people in the UK. We will be drawing on Rachel's lived experience of police brutality, the mental health system, and psychiatric wards.

Importantly, she is doing this at the same time as battling the system to get the care and support she needs to survive. As well as battling the state to pursue the justice and accountability that she deserves.

About the Role

Rachel experiences co-morbid conditions that are disabling. These include: Fibromyalgia, Chronic Fatigue Syndrome, Joint Hypermobility Syndrome, Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (Complex), Depression, Anxiety, Dyslexia and Dyspraxia.

This results in physical, mental and learning access needs that can prevent Rachel from working and even being able to access basic care. This position is required in absence of any suitable care being available through state systems.

We are looking to engage a Personal Assistant, to support Rachel in meeting her access needs as she works towards a brighter future for herself and other marginalized people. You do not need formal qualifications or training, but you should have some knowledge of Neurodiversity, Mental Health and Social Justice.

The role is pastoral and supportive, and requires a high level of responsiveness to Rachel's particular needs and ways of working. You will work with care, organisational and access needs as your core purpose, whilst helping Rachel to research and navigate new work and care possibilities.

You should be willing to travel to meet Rachel at her home in North West London,

and may occasionally accompany her during domestic trips. Other tasks will be able to be done remotely.

The ideal candidate will also have an appreciation of creative practice; a supportive/organisational background; access to their own transport; dog-friendly.

Hours, pay and contract:

We expect around 8-10 hours per week. The contract is initially for 4 weeks, with mind to securing further funding for a more long term solution. We will look to discuss working days and hours at the interview stage, taking into account your needs as well as Rachel's.

We propose an hourly rate of £17.50 per hour. Unfortunately, we are currently unable to cover expenses beyond the basic hourly rate. If this presents problems for you, please get in touch and explain your requirements and we'll see what can be done.

This is an initial contract of four weeks, with the potential to continue working together on future projects.

- o Is enthusiastic about the arts, social justice and mental health
- Has some awareness of racial trauma and police brutality
- Is able to provide at least one professional and one personal character reference
